

#### FROM THE SPIRITUAL ADVISOR

One of the key attributes of Christianity is love. Jesus answered the challenge from a teacher of the law on which is the greatest commandment. His reply is found in Mark 12:29 -31 "The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. 30 Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' 31 The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

In his discussion with Nicodemus in John 3 we find Jesus presenting the scripture that almost everyone has heard or read. Joh 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. In fact, Jesus' most repeated commandment was to love. John 13:34-to love one another and the very next verse that we will be identified as disciples "if you love one another". The authors of the Epistles also emphasized love as an important aspect of the faith.

One of the influences in my walk with Christ has been Steve Brown of Keylife Ministries. He teaches often through principles and one that I've found very profound is this: "You can't love until you have been loved and then only to the extent that you have been loved." So many people never really find love; only what the world may present as love. That is until they encounter Jesus.

Even then their experience may be shrouded by their environment so that they never really are able to love someone else, let alone God. But get them sequestered in a church building for four days with folks that have experienced that level of love. Folks that have been loved so much by the God Head and His disciples that they can love others sacrificially. That's what perpetuates the kingdom. The lyrics from the song Pass it On that we sing often within the community I think describe why so many members of the community give of their time, talents and treasure to continue to serve on these weekends.

You'll want to pass it on

#### **Upcoming Weekend Dates:**

Men's Weekend: September 25 – 28, 2025 Women's Weekend: October 16 – 19, 2025

A \$50 registration fee is required, which helps cover the cost of the weekend.

The weekend is intentionally structured with a specific flow—each component, including rollos, meditations, talks, activities, and events, is placed in a particular order to build upon the last and guide candidates through a meaningful spiritual journey. Missing even one part is like leaving out a piece of a puzzle —the full picture cannot be seen or fully understood without it. To preserve the integrity of a weekend and the experience it offers, **it's essential that all candidates are present for its entirety**. Once a candidate begins a weekend, they are expected to remain for the duration. If a candidate expresses a desire or need to leave, their sponsor will be notified immediately. If a candidate does leave the weekend, they will not be permitted to return. To attend and complete a future weekend, a new candidate registration form and fee must be submitted.

**Important**: To help ensure a positive and well-supported experience, we ask that each sponsor limit themselves to **no more than two candidates per weekend**. Sponsoring involves several key responsibilities, which can be reviewed in detail on our website.

The success of a DeColores weekend relies deeply on prayer, service and support of the community. Your involvement is not only appreciated—it's essential. #### **Respecting Boundaries**

To help protect the sacred space of the weekend and provide the best possible experience for the candidates, we ask that **volunteers and sponsors remain only in the areas designated for their service**.

Whether you're serving in the kitchen, participating in 24-hour prayer or praying for a rollista, please remain in your assigned area.

Do **not walk through hallways, sleeping areas, or around the Rollo Room**. Respecting these boundaries helps foster an environment of concentration and trust—free from unnecessary distractions.

#### Exceptions are limited to the following individuals, and only during their specific responsibilities:

- The **photographer** during Friday pictures
- The President or President Team

The person giving the "Going Home" talk on Sunday

#### **Cell Phones**

• Use of **cell phones is not permitted** by candidates or inside team members.

This helps maintain an atmosphere of focus, presence, and spiritual openness.

#### **Serenade & Closing**

Serenade and Closing are open **only to individuals who have completed a DeColores or similar Cursillo-style weekend**.

Please note: **Children are not permitted**, and **childcare is not provided** during these events.

There is to be no pictures, recording or videotaping during the closing or any part of a weekend.

If you are transporting someone you sponsored, please plan to wait in an alternate space during the meeting.

- Willing to accept the commitment of service to the Community and Secretariat.
- A written resume of the nominees' qualifications must be submitted with the nomination.

#### **Duties of Vice President / President / Past President:**

#### Vice President

 Provide full support to the President in carrying out the responsibilities of the Secretariat. Assumes the President's duties in their absence.

#### President

- Presides over, and directs all meetings of the Secretariat.
- In the absence of the President, Vice President, and Past President, appoints another Secretariat member to conduct meetings.
- Serves as the official representative of the Southwest Michigan DeColores Community.
- Meets with each Rector/ess prior to their weekend to evaluate plans, offer guidance and ensure alignment with the bylaws and weekend guidelines.
- Distributes and maintains key materials: Rector/ess Manual, Head Cook Cookbook, Head Coordinator team folders and master copies.
- Attends a scheduled team meeting for each weekend to ensure conformity to the guidelines of the weekend and bylaws.
- Gives the "Money Talk" (also known as the "Sermon on the Amount") during each DeColores weekend.
- Represents the Southwest Michigan DeColores Community at Closings and provides community announcements.
- Maintains & stores Servant Surveys and distributes them as needed.

#### Past President

- Provides full support to both the President and Vice President.
- Assumes the President's duties in the absence of both the President and Vice President.
- Organizes the Secretariat Commissioning, held at the January Board meeting.
- Appoints the chair of the Fourth Day Workshop.
- Acts as an authorized signer on accounts in the absence of the Treasurer.
- Oversees the incorporation of board-approved decisions into appropriate relevant manuals.
- Receives and securely manages login IDs and passwords for various platforms from the Website Administrator.
